## BRIEF ABOUT 1<sup>st</sup> NLC

MIT School of Government (MIT-SOG) is the first institute of its kind in Asia that is committed to strengthening the fabric of Bharat's Democratic Leadership. It was established by Shri Rahul Karad in the year 2005. The MIT-SOG initiated Bharatiya Chhatra Sansad (BCS) in 2011 as a leading national platform for students interested in public welfare and development of the country. This initiative bears testimony to Shri Rahul Karad's firm belief in the democratic process and his abiding faith in the youth of the country. Unique initiatives like National Women's Parliament (NWP), National Teachers' Congress (NTC), and Rashtriya Sarpanch Sansad are driven by a nationalistic vision. The deliberations on these platforms, along with a firm belief that education needs a strong connection with leadership, culminated in the initiation of the National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat).

National Legislators' Conference Bharat (NLC Bharat) is a platform of Members of Legislative Assemblies (MLAs) and Members of Legislative Councils (MLCs) across the nation gathered for the first time at one place for exchanging ideas. The first edition of NLC Bharat took place in Mumbai from 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> June 2023, where MLAs and MLCs from the political parties and all the States and UTs were presented with a unique opportunity to interact with one other. The conference was conducted with the objectives of cross-learning and enhancement of legislative effectiveness at its core. The legislators gained experiential learning through a mix of thematic discussions and thoughtfully curated large-format plenary sessions along with brainstorming parallel sessions amongst the legislators. NLC Bharat also showcased States' and UTs' pavilions, their commendable practices, and led to extensive informal interactions amongst the legislators, party leaders and business-industry leaders. Sessions on strengthening democracy with the participation of acclaimed national and global leaders also took place during the conference. The conference provided a platform to the MLAs and MLCs to creatively showcase the cultural flavour of their region. NLC Bharat proved to be a true celebration and reflection of democracy and its strength- its elected representatives!

- Create an institutional framework for sustained activities to empower the State legislatures, improve the connection between State Legislatures and civil society, conduct research and evaluation, and foster interstate and international cooperation amongst State Legislatures through collective wisdom of legislators.

### Response and Popularity:

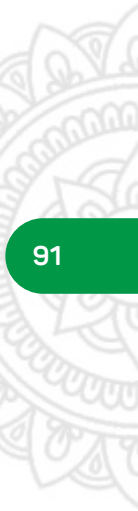

**MIT School of Government Display Partnering with State Legislatures to establish Leadership School under the aegis of every State Legislature**

MIT School of Government (MIT-SOG) has been conceptualized by Shri. Rahul V. Karad, the Executive President of Dr. Vishwanath Karad MIT World Peace University with a vision of creating ethical, spirited, and committed political leadership for the country from the grassroots and from all walks of life. MIT School of Government (MIT-SOG) is the first school of its kind to create future political leaders. Initiated in the year 2005, it offers a two-year Master’s program in Political Leadership & Government (MPG).

The two-year Master’s degree is an experiential learning program wherein the first year comprises campus-based learning through classroom lectures by core Faculties, visiting faculties, and eminent personalities from politics, social, bureaucracy, judiciary, media, and corporate. Along with lectures, there are field visits and study tours. The second year comprises training and internships in the

following areas – Constituency-based, Issue-based/ NGO, Media, and a final career-based internship with offices of political leaders and political parties. It emphasizes the vital role of educated young minds in pursuing politics as a noble profession, steering towards the greater good. Encouraging the youth to be active agents of change and public service, it seeks to inspire future leaders. Now, in order to raise the cause further, the MIT School of Government has come forward to establish the Political Leadership Schools under the aegis of every Vidhan Sabha by partnering with the respective State Legislatures. Following six State Legislatures signed MoUs with MIT SOG to establish leadership schools under their aegis: Uttar Pradesh State Legislature, Karnataka State Legislature, Sikkim State Legislature, Rajasthan State Legislature, Himachal Pradesh State Legislature, and Maharashtra State Legislature.

Human development and public health improvement is a primary target of sustainable development. Through my work in Gadchiroli, I have found that a major danger to public health, economic progress, and social harmony, is alcoholism. According to the 2016 WHO Global Burden of Disease Study, alcohol is one of the top seven leading causes of disease and disability worldwide, associated with 230 diseases, and being the number one cause of death for individuals of the age group 15 to 49. Alcoholism hurts households, neighbourhoods, livelihoods. According to a study by scholars from leading medical institutions such as AIIMs and NIMHANS, published in the IJDP, the total societal burden associated with expenditure on alcoholism is Rs. 98,000 billion, deducting the revenue from tax. It is to be noted that this money could go towards education and upliftment of impoverished households. Tobacco and alcohol are not merely pleasurable goods but are instruments of an unstable society, akin to the modern cholera and plague. However, prohibition alone is not enough to curb this social menace. Many legislators and policy makers are unaware of a 1975 excise control law that prohibits sale of liquor in tribal majority areas. Through community vigilance, successful social campaigning, de-addiction programs, and reducing both demand and supply, alcohol consumption was reduced from 40.8% to 25.01% while tobacco consumption was reduced from 43.6% to 34.5%

## Instruments and Impact of Sustainable Development

### LEAD SPEAKER



Considering the within-country distribution of vulnerability, in addition to exposure to climate change, could substantially change estimated within-country differences between the rich and poor in income losses from climate change. Hotter temperature can reduce labour productivity, work hours, and labour income. The effects of heat are likely to be a joint consequence of both exposure and vulnerability. Mumbai, financial capital of India covers 437.71 square kilometers, is facing a major problem of city development because of the existing slum area. 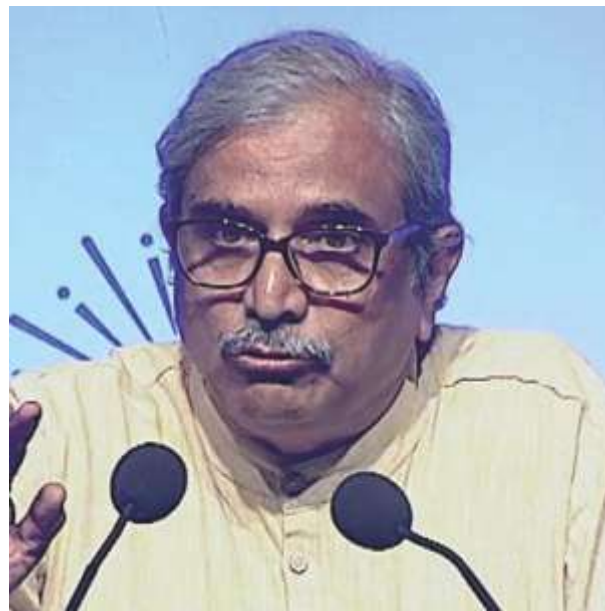

## Welfare Schemes: Uplifting the Last Person

### LEAD SPEAKER

What is the difference between welfare and well-being? State has a role to play in creating certain welfare schemes. If we all will be farewell then there will be welfare. We all have to remember in our own languages. Until 1991 the state was doing everything for welfare. After 1991, when we did liberalization, privatization, and globalization common people have felt it very difficult in this competitive world. So we have to attend to this very important section of the population and as people's responsibilities it is our primary responsibility we have to do. Between 1966 and 2022 we have introduced hundreds of schemes which are either central schemes or centrally sponsored schemes. There were various schemes such as in 1956 one scheme, 69 one scheme, 70 to 79 three schemes, 80 to 89 two schemes, 90 to 99 nine schemes, 2000 to 2014 thirty- two schemes and in 2014 we had 50 schemes. If we see that the number for the central welfare schemes has been increased. It affects the individual. Welfare scheme is oriented for individual benefit. Identification is both because bureaucracy bungling and our own biases. We go to the wrong identification due to this. In wrong identification we need to focus on the questions such as what is the proportion of problems with the political presentation, what is the problem with bureaucracy and also the problem of dishonesty of our own citizens? Why are there fraud ration cards? Who is responsible for that? Government want to do many things. We also need to think about the process of program implementation. We speak about ease of business which is for private enterprises. What about the government programs? We need to work on ease of implementation for the beneficiary. In history is there any complaint by any villagers that they have drinking water problems and they were asking to provide it? For The last 50 years we have had this problem. I will give an example of Rajasthan where there is the least amount of rainfall. Water management was people's problem, not the state's problem. We don't need to make our population beggars next to the government. We need to explain the benefits to the people. We need to raise the pride of the people.

The Maharashtra Right to Public Services Act is one such initiative by the government, which uses the ICT to effectively contribute in the process of delivering welfare schemes to the needy. The public services are basically provided online. We have also taken cognizance of the fact that not all people are equipped with technology, and so 'Seva Kendras' have been introduced for such people to get appropriate assistance regarding the services. It is unconventional in a sense that one can track one's application electronically, offering some sense of transparency to the citizens. The collectors in the state are given the added responsibility of a controlling officer of the RTS. Citizens need not run from one office to another, from one table to another as it has improved the efficiency of services by making digital signatures valid. To improve public services, I would suggest other states to form a similar portal to simplify the work of the citizens. The Maharashtra Right to Public Services Act, with its use of ICT, has streamlined the delivery of welfare schemes and public services. The introduction of online services, Seva Kendras, electronic tracking, and valid digital signatures has improved convenience, transparency, and efficiency.

We, at the University of Notre Dame, are working towards studying the reasons behind the backwardness of people Below Poverty Line and what can be made to do better. As opposed to many other countries, India has a substantial amount of people below poverty line who are struggling nutritionally, resulting in multiple bodily shortcomings and ailments. Due to this very reason, there are ailments such as anaemia spreading in the rural areas of several states. States such as Bihar, Punjab etc. have implemented several state welfare schemes that work towards the betterment of their people at a grassroots level. However, for the absolute development of the so-called "Last Person", there are certain criteria to be met. These criteria are decreased infant mortality, decreased foeticides and pre-natal deaths and increased health of mothers. The solution that I would like to suggest in this gathering is the use of certain re-engineered consumables. The main one among these is Double Fortified Salt. Double-fortified salt, also known as DFS, is a specially fortified salt that contains two essential micronutrients: iron and iodine. This innovative approach aims to address widespread deficiencies of these micronutrients, particularly in low and middle-income countries. Iron deficiency is a leading cause of anaemia, affecting millions of people worldwide, while iodine deficiency can lead to thyroid disorders and impaired cognitive development, particularly in children. By combining both iron and iodine in salt, double-fortified salt offers a convenient and effective way to combat these deficiencies.

First, I would like to say that when we become ML, then the priorities of the idea that the government represents are always there. All you MLAs represent different states. The population Himachal Pradesh is 72 lakh and there are only 12 districts. So, every government tries to road map in that way to felicitate the people of Himachal Pradesh. I remember the year I came into politics in 1995. After that I conclude that Antyodaya, means this was the concept of Mahatma Gandhi. The society where they stand in the last line, we should do something special for him. That concept may be and that may also be on the agenda of a political party who ruled the states. Taking care of and welfare of the people living in that state should be their topmost priority. When I was Health Minister, most of the money was spent on medicines. To take care of that, there was a Yojna called Ayushman Yojna and this Yojna was adopted by most of the states. 350 crores were spent on this health scheme. Later, we developed another health scheme called Mukhyamantri Arogya Dava Yojna. We provided 360 medicines to the medical colleges as well as health sub centers. Himachal Pradesh is a growing state. There are pharmaceutical companies that produce 35% of the medicines produced all over India. Antyoday Anyojna initially started in the year 1990. This ideology, Vasudhaiva Kutumbkam should also be kept in our minds. This kind of development is also taking place in Himachal Pradesh. Only when we manage time, can we create more responsibilities and more outputs.

We also got work for Kedarnath Badrinath trust. One scheme was launched on 5 th March, and we were able to start all the registration process. The Chief Minister said that this was a zero-defect scheme and was completed in 90 days. This whole process was very systematic, and it has given a lot of sense of how a governance scheme can be governed. There were many benefits of this scheme, live photographs were captured, it was a kind of empowerment, hundred percent paperless, women could easily link their bank account with Aadhar card. This was the very first scheme where IT process was thought along with the scheme guidelines, it took only a minute for one single application.

While it may not be feasible for every member to have a large personal staff due to financial constraints, there are alternative approaches to support legislators effectively so the 50 states in the USA have different staff models. There are personal staff, the one who prepares the bill, researchers, clerical staff. Each member should have 20 people helping him. But many times it is not possible because we need to pay money. In that case the central research hub can be developed. Every member should have an understanding of the rules and the procedures. Training can be provided to the newly elected members. Establishing a central research hub can provide shared resources, expertise, and support to all legislators. This hub can consist of a team of researchers, policy analysts, and legal experts who can assist legislators in drafting bills, conducting research, and analyzing complex issues. By pooling resources, the central hub can provide valuable assistance to legislators who may not have extensive personal staff. Offering comprehensive training programs for newly elected members is essential. These programs can cover legislative rules, procedures, ethics, and other important aspects of governance. By providing the necessary knowledge and skills, training can empower legislators to navigate the legislative process more effectively and fulfill their responsibilities. It's important to recognize that finding the right balance between adequate support and fiscal responsibility is crucial. The specific approach to providing assistance will depend on the resources available, the needs of the legislators, and the priorities of the legislative body.

It appears that almost everyone agrees on one point - the need to increase the number of days the legislature functions. In Bihar, for instance, we currently have a budget session of about 45 days and the other two sessions last merely a week each. However, as elected legislators, our main responsibility lies in enacting laws and improving governance. To achieve this, we must extend the duration of legislative sessions, given the significant expenses involved in running the government and compensating legislators. Having a legislative session that lasts only a month or 45 days does not seem justified, and this is a point of unanimous agreement. Personally, I have always held this viewpoint, and I am known for expressing it clearly. During discussions in the house, I have questioned the rationale behind such brief and infrequent sessions that result in substantial expenses in terms of salaries and facilities. The people deserve better representation, and I firmly believe that the executive should not encroach upon the legislative domain. I hope to see elected representatives engage more with their constituents, understand their issues, and work towards solving them.

Our Tibetan democracy follows a unique model known as party-less democracy, where there are no political parties involved. Instead, elections are based on geographical locations, with a total of 45 members representing various areas. Constituency-based elections are not conducted in this system. The election process and campaigning are significant responsibilities, especially considering that Tibetans are scattered across 11 locations in India, requiring extensive campaigning efforts. Additionally, there are 12 members in the standing committee, which comprises finance, administration, and political committees. The parliamentary session lasts for 10 days, during which members have the opportunity to ask numerous questions to the ministers. It is essential for members of parliament to attend sessions consistently. Failure to attend two consecutive sessions may result in termination. When the party nominates ministers, the house proposes and votes for the candidates' eligibility, ensuring a democratic and participatory process. After being elected as an MLA, I took a demographic survey and analyzed the needs of the community and built roads, schools, health camps, and gained the trust of the people. I have started working towards disability welfare and conducted a 3-day purple fest - where 500 delegates covering across 21 disabilities worked towards developing more accessible policies. We made Goa more accessible, particularly at popular tourist destinations. Next January, we are conducting a week long fest for Divyang people from 8th to the 13, to improve the welfare of disabled communities and empower them in education, autonomy, and social spheres.

As part of the Swayampurna Goa scheme, we have attempted to make local villages self-sufficient. By having Grade 1 officers/IAS officers attend village panchayats and interact with locals to resolve their issues, we are able to connect with people at the grassroots level. I am glad to say that PM Modi wishes to emulate the scheme across the country. We should be transparent, loyal, and honest to our voters as they give us an opportunity to serve them. I believe that your participation in this conference shows your willingness to grow and learn to better develop your constituencies. The biggest happiness is seeing a poor man be alleviated. A little effort from our side can bring immense change and prosperity to the lives of so many people.

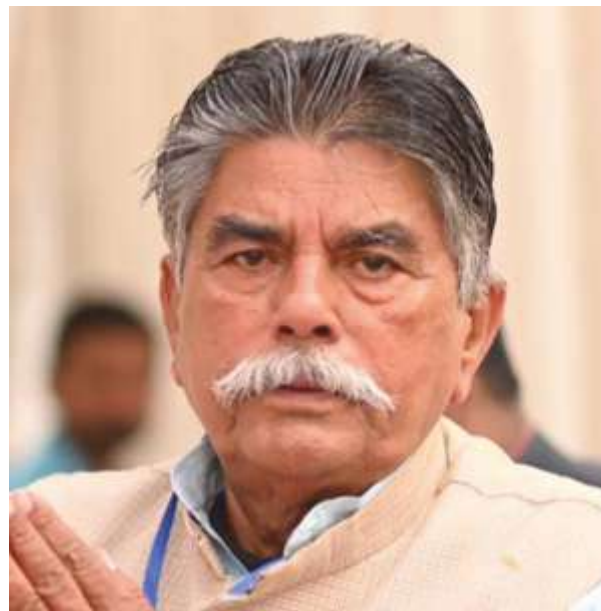

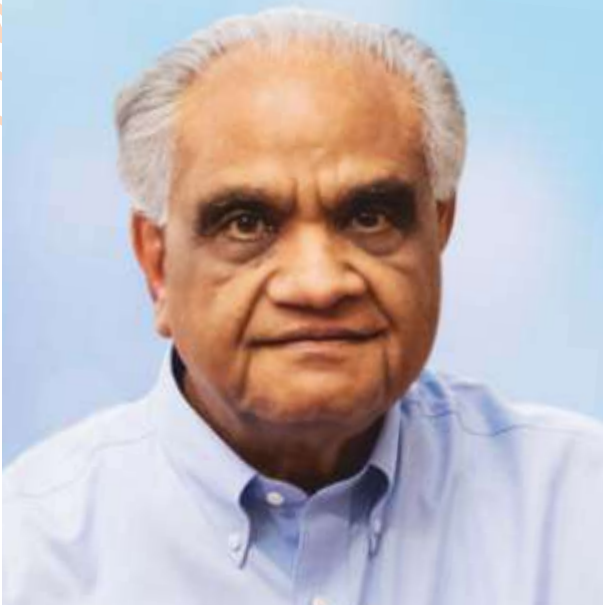

The legal knowledge of the population needs an increase. The basic assumption is that the state needs coercive capacity to do that, but the states have other tools and capacities that they can employ. I have done a study on the India-Nepal border trying to look at the people's compliance with the regulations from both the countries. The study resulted in showing that there is higher compliance in Nepal as compared to India which is non-compliant in regard to firewood collection from the protected wildlife reserves. It is also seen as the State's failure in the case of Chitwan National Park that communication of the legal norms and regulations is very limited. It has also been observed that people acquire legal knowledge through observation/ watching. An experiment in the field was conducted where transmission of legal knowledge was undertaken by the local leaders, after a follow-up and measurement of legal knowledge of the people was done it was seen that local leaders as the source of knowledge has worked very well. Another aspect, that is, India's compliance with the teacher: student ratio has been good as compared to Nepal. While, the child labour regulations compliance is seen to be low in both India and Nepal.

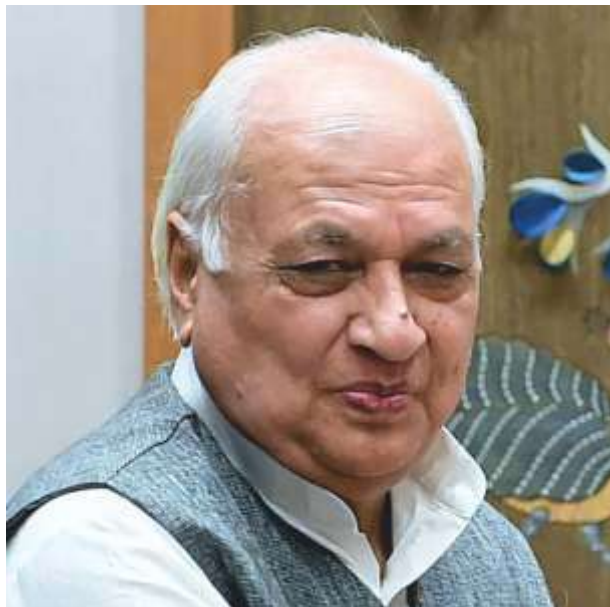

### About the Session

## About the Session

The year 2047 will mark the centennial anniversary of India's independence, signifying a noteworthy landmark in the country's progression. The objective of this session was to examine the projected progression of the association between law and citizens in India by the current significant year. This round table discussion aimed to analyze the potential impact of progress in diverse domains, including technology, ecological preservation, and human rights, on the legal framework and the position of individuals within it. The objective of this session was to pinpoint significant domains of change, possible obstacles, and the courses of action that could be implemented to guarantee the efficacy and pertinence of the law in safeguarding and enabling individuals in the forthcoming times. Various dignitaries from the legal fraternity, including the judiciary, academia, and industry, graced the occasion bringing diverse perspectives to the table.

The introductory note was given by the Chairman of the session, Dr. Nishith Desai. In his discourse, Dr. Desai pointed out the significance of Democracy and how the same shall be perceived in the coming days in order to shape our legislation. Through his skilled deliberation, he had skillfully navigated

the conversations, ensuring that all participants had an opportunity to share their insights and ideas. Lalit Bhasin addressed the conference, shedding light on the challenges posed by an overwhelming number of cases and the limitations of relying solely on litigation. He highlighted the staggering volume of over 5 crore cases and emphasized that increasing the number of judges alone would not solve the problem. Aditya Sondhi firmly opposes moral policing, considering it a direct violation of personal freedom and an encroachment upon the principles of a democratic society. He asserts that individuals should have the right to make choices that may diverge from societal norms, as long as they do not infringe upon the rights of others. Shri. Nitin Podar said that by educating students about the principles of justice, equality, and human rights, educational institutions promote a sense of fairness and encourage individuals to recognize and challenge injustice in various forms. Adv. Somasekhar Sundaresan shared his insights on the process of drafting effective laws. He emphasized the importance of distinguishing between a great law and a great draft, proposed a draft solution, stressed the need to acknowledge problems, highlighted the significance of pre-legislative consultation, discussed the empirical measurement of costs and advantages, questioned the effectiveness of mandatory sunset clauses, emphasized the mandatory review of laws, and encouraged reflection on whether desired objectives have been achieved. Aniket Nikam focused on the importance of simplifying the language of laws, the retributive form of punishment, overcoming colonial influences, ensuring accessible justice, utilizing technology for our benefit, and involving prisoners in legal reform. Adv. Dr. Shrikant Malegaokar, in his address at the conference, underscored the importance of citizen participation in the lawmaking process. He emphasized the need for effective mechanisms that allow citizens to contribute to the development of laws, such as public consultations, open forums, and deliberative processes. Adv. Firoze B. Andhyarujina addressed key aspects related to the preservation of democracy, fundamental rights, and the need for effective mechanisms in the legal system. Mrunalini Deshmukh discussed the significance of the family institution and the influence of the 1955 law on its structure. She shed light on the importance of the family unit and how legal frameworks, specifically governed by the 1955 law, shape and impact family dynamics.

Conclusion is the discussion emphasized the need for envisioning a legal framework that aligns with the evolving needs and aspirations of citizens in the year 2047.

### About the Session

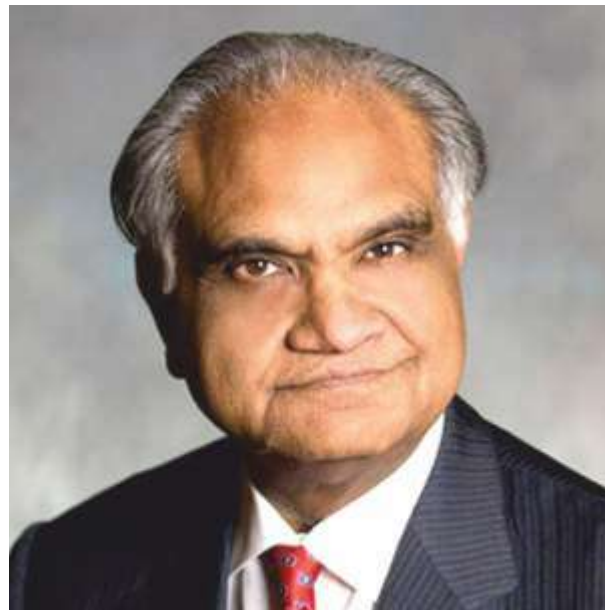

Anita Kelly, Consul General of Ireland, drew attention to the role played by G20. Dr. Ram Charan spoke about the Young Presidents' Organisation and how their monthly meets have enabled exchange of ideas and collaboration for international business. Wayne Harper, Senator of Utah, USA, speaking on the collaboration between legislators to legislators, stressed on learning from other states' ways of governance. He emphasised on the training of the legislators for quality governance. On this Neelam Gorhe, Chairman, Maharashtra Legislative Council, gave importance on the study centres for women's studies. She gave importance on the need of dialogues between research organisations and legislators.

#### About the Session

Legislatures have always been the cornerstone of democratic societies, responsible for enacting laws, providing oversight, and representing the interests of the people. However, they have long faced numerous challenges that hindered their effectiveness and undermined the principles of good governance. During this panel discussion, our esteemed panelists delved into the heart of these challenges and explored potential pathways forward.

Major Points:

- **Paperless Documents Initiative:** State secretary of Odisha pointed paperless documentation initiatives to streamline their operations and reduce the environmental impact of excessive paper usage. This involves digitizing legislative documents, such as bills, reports, and committee papers, and making them accessible to legislators electronically. The transition to paperless systems presents challenges related to technological infrastructure, data security, and ensuring

equal access to information for all members.

- **Remedial Measures for Pending Bills:** The delay in the passage of bills is a common challenge faced by legislatures. To overcome these challenges streamlining the legislative process, enhancing coordination, strengthening committee systems, and promoting constructive dialogue and consensus-building among legislators.
- **Powers of the Assembly:** Legislative assemblies have the power to enact laws, scrutinize the executive branch, & represent people's interests. To this end, legislatures need to strengthen their oversight mechanisms, like parliamentary committees, to hold the executive accountable.
- **Pendency of Financial Committees:** Financial committees, such as the Public Accounts Committee or the Appropriations Committee, play a crucial role in overseeing government finances and ensuring accountability. However, these committees often face challenges related to the pendency of cases, resource constraints, and lack of coordination with the executive.
- **Bill Passing Delay Issues:** Delays in the passage of bills can hinder the legislative process and impede the implementation of important policies. To address this issue, legislatures need to improve coordination and communication among political parties, government departments, and civil society organizations. Clearer legislative timelines, and dedicated efforts to build consensus on issues can help reduce delays in bill passage.
- **Judicial Activism:** The active role of courts in policy-making and legislative functions had the potential to disrupt the delicate equilibrium between the legislature, executive, and judiciary. This raised questions about the separation of powers and the appropriate role of the judiciary within a democratic system.
- **Committee Formation:** The formation of committees played a vital role in facilitating the smooth functioning of assemblies. All panelist acknowledged that well-structured committees allowed for in-depth examination of bills, policy formulation, and oversight of the executive.

The session was concluded by Shri. P.D.T. Achary with meaningful insights from the discussions. He emphasized that State secretaries have a major role to advise the speaker, and their guidance must be aligned with the constitution.

The challenge before all of us is how we develop India in the near future. The dream that our Prime Minister has for India is to make India a developed country by 2047 when we celebrate hundred years of our independence. There are challenges we have to go through to maintain a trajectory of fast economic growth, and also the serial cost of equity is not very easy. The democracy that we conceived and the secular democracy that we adopted must be standing because that alone will ensure that India becomes a prosperous country. One of the immediate challenges which legislators face today is what to do with the anti-defection law, as it was conceived in 1985 by the late Rajiv Gandhi with particular events happening around us. That served us to some extent; it had faults and then there was a major overall anti-defection law in 2003, and we have today the law as it stands which was amended in 2003. I would really ask you to ponder if the Constitution framers considered a separation of powers between the three arms of the government- the legislature, the judiciary, and the executive but we don't seem to be anywhere near that ideal.

I think the moment Parliament elects the leader of the largest party and that leader becomes the Prime Minister and he has a cabinet at his disposal in a huge bureaucracy to govern, that executioner becomes all-powerful, and the Parliament virtually commits a hierarchy.

I have observed that many times MLAs don't come prepared to the discussions and leave/don't attend assembly meetings which reduces the efficiency of these meetings. I strongly advise against these practices to anyone who aims to be a good legislator. I believe just like civil servants (IAS, IPS, IFS, IRS, etc) legislators should also be trained before they join the house (Minimum of 3 months). This is a platform to learn from one another and share experiences. It would be great if this conference is held every year. I believe we should conduct assemblies on a more frequent basis than what we meet today and it has to be a part of the rules to meet once within every few days not like the existing law which obliges to meet only once in every 6 months. I encourage each one of you to have very active participation in House and its committees.

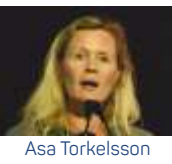

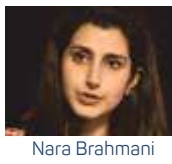

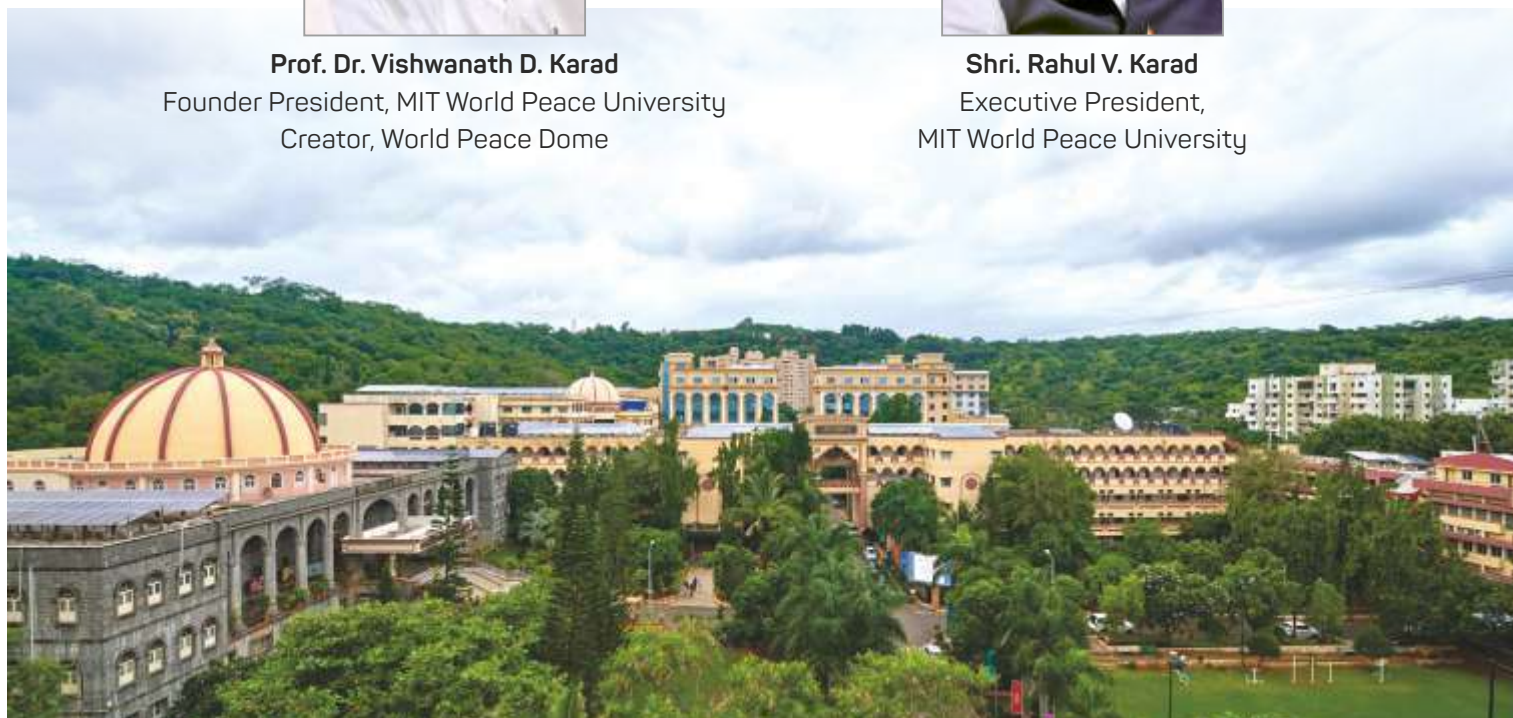

Remarkably, this honor illuminates a pioneering narrative, being the first of its kind across Asia and a rarity as only the second within the Asia-Pacific expanse.

Guided by the far-reaching vision of Prof. Dr. Karad, the Centre orchestrates a symphony of transformative initiatives, orchestrating resonant national and international symposiums. 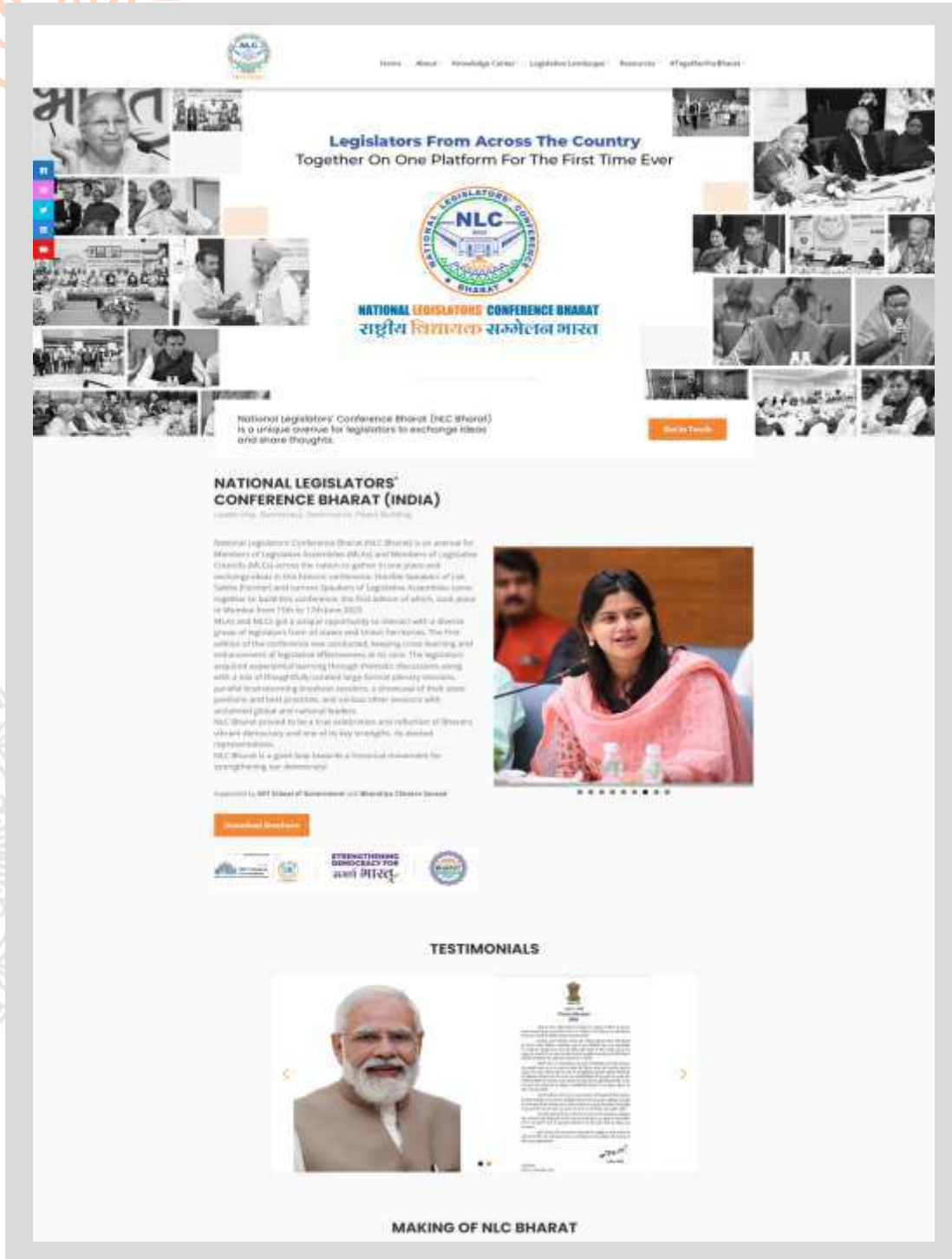

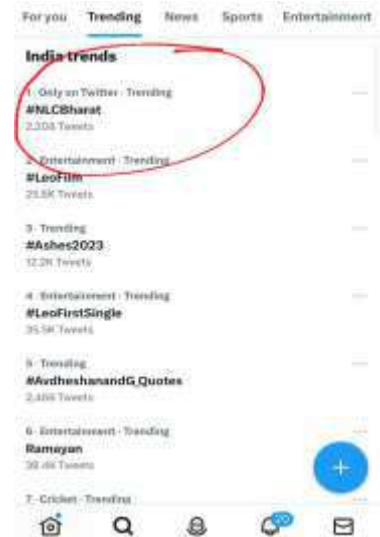
